<p><b>Trick Word Activity:</b> Write your trick words on paper or flash cards.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-place around the house and search for them, reading them as you find them.</li> <li>- hang them up on a wall or place them on a table to knock down with something like a nerf gun or soft throwable item (ex. small bouncy ball) as someone, parent/sibling/adult calls out which words they would like the students to hit.</li> <li>-use them as flash cards</li> <li>-find a fun way to write the trick words (in shaving cream, sand, using sticks or other items, be creative!)</li> </ul>	<p><b>Addition/ Subtraction Activity:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Create addition or subtraction problems (up to 20) with objects outside or around the house.</li> <li>-Create story problems for family members to solve.</li> <li>-Solve missing number problems (ex. <math>2 + \_\_ = 5</math>, <math>\_\_ + 4 = 9</math>, <math>10 - \_\_ = 3</math>, etc.)</li> </ul>	<p><b>Outdoor Activities:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Scavenger Hunt</li> <li>-Nature Walk- Take a walk and discuss all of the different kinds of nature you find around you.</li> <li>-Sun Placement - Trace the movement of the sun by outlining your shadow different times of the day in the same location.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Go on a walk with your whole family.</li> <li>-Create a new game for your family to play.</li> <li>- Learn or come up with a new song.</li> <li>- Put on a play with your siblings/stuffed animals/pets</li> <li>-Create an obstacle course to get from one area to another.</li> </ul>

<p><b>Journal Prompt/Writing Activity:</b> Give the student a prompt and have them write their answer in sentence form. They could draw a picture to go with their sentence(s). Prompt Ex.: "Would you rather....." "If you could wish for one thing....." "What is your favorite....." "What superpower would you want and why?" "What is one kind thing you are going to do today?"</p>	<p><b>Data Activity:</b> -flip a coin, and tally the times it lands on heads or tails. -take a vote from family members on what their favorite things are (favorite vegetable, color, outdoor activity, etc.) and graph it using a bar or picture graph.</p>	<p><b>STEM Activities:</b> -Build a fort using random materials -Invent something to solve a problem in your home (ex. chores) - Create a way to communicate with others while still practicing social distancing. Use different objects, be creative! (could look like the cans and string method)</p>	<p><b>Social Emotional Learning:</b> - Practice different types of breathing. (gonoodle has elephant breath, bubble breath, etc.) <b>Youtube:</b> The Wiggle Tales Cosmic Kids Yoga</p>
<p><b>Independent Reading:</b> Read for about 20 minutes. Have the student tell you what the story was about (characters, setting, etc.) -Could read aloud to a sibling, stuffed animal, or pet.</p>	<p><b>Counting Activity:</b> -Count how many of one object you can find around the house or outside (could be things like anything that is blue, is a square, books, shoes, etc.) - Use pasta or other small items to count by twos, fives, and tens.</p>	<p><b>Personal Knowledge:</b> -Learn your address -Learn your phone number -Talk about safety plans for your household (What to do in the case of fire, tornado, how to contact 911 etc.)</p>
