<p><u>Letter Activities:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Write uppercase and lowercase letters using different household items (markers, crayons, chalk, shaving cream, etc)</li> <li>-Practice letter sounds</li> </ul> <p><u>Phonics Activities:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Think of rhyming words</li> <li>-Say the sounds in CVC words (cat, men, pin, fox, mug, etc)</li> <li>-Parent says the sounds in the word and child writes them</li> </ul>	<p><u>Number Activities:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Write numbers as high as you can using different household items (markers, crayons, chalk, shaving cream, dirt, etc)</li> <li>-Count to 100</li> <li>-Count by 2's, 5's, 10's</li> <li>-Count backwards</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Draw and label the parts of a plant, butterfly, insect, etc.</li> <li>-Find different foods in the house and discuss what part of the plant they come from</li> <li>-Describe different objects around the house</li> </ul> <p><u>Outdoor Activities:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Nature walk: Take a walk and discuss all of the different kinds of nature you find around you.</li> <li>-Observe the weather</li> </ul>



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<p><u>Trick Word Activities:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Write your trick words on paper or flash cards.</li> <li>-place around the house and search for them, reading them as you find them.</li> <li>- hang them up on a wall or place them on a table to knock down with something like a nerf gun or soft throwable item (ex. small bouncy ball) as someone, parent/sibling/adult calls out which words they would like the students to hit.</li> <li>-use them as flash cards</li> <li>-find a fun way to write the trick words (in shaving cream, sand, using sticks or other items, be creative!)</li> <li>-Find them using a flashlight</li> </ul>	<p><u>Addition/Subtraction Activities:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Create addition or subtraction problems (up to 10) with objects outside or around the house (rocks, snacks, candy, etc)</li> <li>-Create a story problem, write the matching number sentence (I have 3 apples and get 2 more from the store, how many do I have all together? <math>3+2=5</math>)</li> <li>-Domino/dice math, add the dots together, write the number sentence</li> </ul> <p><u>Greater than/Less than:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Play War with cards</li> <li>-Have them guess your number by telling them greater than or less than</li> </ul>	<p><u>Social Studies:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Draw a map of your house, give directions on how to get to each room</li> </ul> <p><u>Social/Emotional Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Practice different types of breathing. (gonoodle has elephant breath, bubble breath, etc.)</li> </ul> <p><u>Youtube:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Wiggle Tales</li> <li>Cosmic Kids Yoga</li> </ul>
<p><u>Journal Prompt/Writing Activity:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Glve the student a prompt and have them write their answer in sentence form. They could draw a picture to go with their sentence(s).</li> </ul> <p>Prompt Ex. What is your favorite food?    What do you like to do outside?    What is your favorite sport?    Where is your favorite place to be?    Who is someone that is special to you?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Students could also draw a picture answering a prompt and describe their picture to someone</li> </ul>	<p><u>Data Activity:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-flip a coin, and tally the times it lands on heads or tails.</li> <li>-take a vote from family members on what their favorite things are (favorite vegetable, color, outdoor activity, etc.) and graph it using a bar or picture graph.</li> </ul>	<p><u>STEM Activities:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Build a fort using random materials</li> <li>-Invent something to solve a problem in your home (ex. chores)</li> <li>-Build something using blocks or legos</li> <li>- Create a way to communicate with others while still practicing social distancing. Use different objects, be creative! (could look like the cans and string method)</li> </ul>
<p><u>Reading Activities:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Have someone read a book to you</li> <li>-Read a book with someone</li> <li>-Look at the pictures in a book and tell yourself a story</li> </ul>	<p><u>Counting Activities:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Count how many of one object you can find around the house or outside (could be things like anything that is blue, is a square, books, shoes, etc.)</li> <li>- Use pasta, snacks, candy or other small items to count to 20 or beyond</li> </ul>	<p><u>Personal Knowledge:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Learn your address</li> <li>-Learn your phone number</li> <li>-Practice tying shoes, buttoning and zipping</li> <li>-Talk about safety plans for your household (What to do in the case of fire, tornado, how to contact 911 etc.)</li> </ul>
